


The age of consent in Saskatchewan

There can be no relationship of trust, authority, dependence or exploitation; if any of these conditions are present, consent is void.


- **16 years of age is the minimum for consent;** 15 years or younger cannot legally consent to sexual activity
- **14 & 15 year-olds can consent to sexual activity** with someone who is **not more than 5 years older** (peer group exception)
- **12 & 13 year-olds** can consent to sexual activity with **someone who is less than 2 years older** (close in age exception)
- Under **12 years of age cannot consent to sexual activity under any circumstances**

CONSENT




A clear agreement between people to engage in an activity (sexual or otherwise)


Consent ...




IS clear and enthusiastic



IS NOT forced



IS required each time



MAY NOT be present if someone is drunk or high

Consent can be expressed by words or actions everyone can understand. If in doubt, ask!

If someone feels pressured, intimidated, or afraid, they do not consent.

Getting consent in the past or for a different activity is not enough.

Consent requires everyone to be fully conscious and not too drunk or too high.
